Morning Examinations


Aim to be at school no later than 8.15am - avoid the stress of running late!



 A pastry or drink will be available in the restaurant before all morning English, maths and science examinations.

- **8.30am 8.45am:** Tutor Time Equipment check and phones, watches and any other mobile devices handed in (until the end of the day when there is a pm exam). Use the toilet if required. Remember you cannot use the toilet in the first 60 minutes or last 20 minutes of an exam
- **8.45am:** Leave tutor rooms and head to the Lecture Theatre. Sit in your college areas.
- Brief presentation from the subject leader on the exam paper.
- Students make their way to the exam locations dance studio first, followed by rows A Z in the sports hall. Sports hall candidates will go in through the gym, to leave their bags in the gym store room. We aim for a start as close to 9.00am as possible.

Morning Exams





If you are entitled to extra time and the exam runs longer than **11.30am**, you will still get a 20 minute break before returning to your period 3 lesson.

Afternoon Exams

- Lunch from 1pm 1.30pm in the restaurant and then straight into the Lecture Theatre.
- Aim to start the afternoon examinations as soon as possible after 1:30pm.
- Collect mobile devices from college admins after the afternoon exam.

Timetables in Module 5



All students will follow their normal timetables until the end of Module 5 (Friday 27th May)

Adjustments are made in the last 2 weeks of Module 5 to fit around the exams taking place, and to give 1 hour 'masterclasses' prior to each exam

For afternoon exams, masterclasses take place in period 3 (11.30am - 12.15pm) unless there is a timetabled lesson period 1, 2 or 3 anyway. For morning exams, masterclasses take place in period 5 on the day before (2.00pm - 3.15pm) unless there is a timetabled lesson during the day.

Timetabled lessons will continue to be preparation for remaining exams in that subject as no subject will be finished before the end of the Module.

Timetables for the 2 week period from Monday 5th June will be flexible, based around lessons, masterclasses and some study leave.

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Results Day



Thursday 24th August from 9.00am. More specific time details will be shared closer to the time.

Results collection will be followed by a destinations confirmation (i.e. what is the plan for September now results have been received). Internal enrolment into Post-16 at The Leigh takes place before you leave with your results.

If you need to enrol elsewhere, you will be free to go once we have confirmation from of you of your intended destination.



Post-16 at The Leigh

A couple of points to note:

- Places in Post-16 remain open to ALL internal students until Friday 22nd September 2023.
- If your intended destination doesn't materialise on Thursday 24th
 August, we are open until 3.00pm and again between 10.00am and
 2.00pm on Friday 25th August for you to drop in and discuss returning
 to The Leigh.
- As with everyone else hoping to stay, you need to have met the entry requirements for that to happen (5+ GCSEs at Grade 4 or better, incl English and maths).



Tips for parents



Contents

Tip 1: Encourage them to go through the content page of the specification and rank their confidence/knowledge for each topic (out of 10). Add a star to the topics they find trickiest.

These approaches help encourage more purposeful chunking down of revision by topic.




Tip 2: Ask them to explain their highest ranking topics (lots will be routinely over-confident!) and their lowest ranking topics. If they can explain their strengths and weaknesses, it is a helpful start before they build their depth of knowledge on each topic.















Tip 4: After they have spent around 20 minutes working in their revision notebook / flash cards, ask them to close their book / cards, and either explain a topic - in 'Just a Minute' style, or speedily map out the topic/s on paper.








Tip 5: If they're very confident in the topic/s from the guide, they can create their own flashcards on the topic, or even devise their own questions (this can be tricky!).



Leave a bit of time e.g. an hour or a day or two - nudge them to test themselves on the flashcards





more help.

Final tip: After each revision guide spell, get them to explain to you what they are still struggling with, or what they are now more confident on. Get them talking, writing about it, & seeking out



In short, keep them thinking hard about the topics
