| Next step | The student is taken to the withdrawal room for the remainder of that period. They will complete the S2 detention the following day. |

Sanction 1 - 1st time

Your phone will be confiscated by a member of staff and kept in your College Admin Office. It will be returned to you at 3.30pm on the same day (2.30pm on a Wednesday).

Sanction 2 - 2nd time

Your phone will be confiscated by a member of staff and kept in main reception. It will be returned to you at 3.45pm on Friday following a 30 minute SLT detention.

Sanction 3 - 3rd time

Your phone will be confiscated by a member of staff and kept at main reception. It will be returned to a parent/carer after 3.30pm on Friday of that week. You will also have a 60 minute SLT detention.

If you have had all 3 sanctions (M1, M2, M3) during the academic year, you will remain at the M3 threshold for the remainder of the year, and any time the policy is not followed the above sanction will repeat itself.

Speak to your friends instead, play a game on the field, or read a book in the library. No phones are allowed on site at any time of the school day, inside or outside.




The Facts...

- · ½ day missed a week or
- · 1 day every 2 weeks or
- 3 days in a module.
- 1 school year at 90% attendance
- 4 whole weeks of lessons missed!
- 90% attendance over 5 years of secondary school
- ½ a school year missed!!

Persistent Lateness

- If you are 5 minutes late every day that adds up to over 3 days lost each year.
- 15 minutes late every day is the same as being absent for 2 weeks a year.



Chromebooks

All Year 7 students are provided with a loan device for their time here at the academy.

All students physical classes have an accompanying Google Classroom, where all lesson materials are posted for students to access during and after the lessons.

All students also have access to the full Google Education suite, including Google Docs, Slides and Sheets.

When in the academy the students Chromebook is secured through our internet filtering system and Smoothwall safeguarding platform.

The academy is able to monitor everything the student accesses on their Chromebook, and will notify families of any misuse.








Google Classroom



Reading and Literacy in Year 7 at The Leigh



Why is literacy and reading important?

Research shows that there is a correlation between reading ability and success at GCSE, in EVERY subject.

GCSE papers require a reading age of at least 16 years to fully grasp the vocabulary, concepts and questions being given

Every member of staff at Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy recognises the importance of solid reading and comprehension skills, not just through schooling but into further education and the world of work.

Therefore we have a three - pronged strategy to ensure that your child is able to access a range of texts

- Reciprocal Reading
- 2. Reading for Pleasure
- 3. Star Reader Tests

Reciprocal Reading: Part of the Tutor Time programme

This strategy utilises four processes in order to improve reading and comprehension:

- 1. Prediction
- 2. Clarification
- 3. Questioning
- 4. Summarising

- 1. Prediction students try to predict what might happen in the text using clues
- 2. Clarification students use dictionaries to check word meaning
- 3. Questioning tutors discuss section of text with the students to develop their understanding of the writers' ideas
- 4. Summarising students summarise what they have read into main points to demonstrate their understanding

Year 7s have the opportunity to take part in the **Pick 'n' Mix reading** competition, and where an additional challenge is required, the **16B416 Super Challenge**

The **more** times students complete the challenge, the **more** opportunities they have to win!

We are very fortunate here at Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy to have an extensive library full of a range of fiction and non-fiction texts.

Students are encouraged visit the library and take books out to read, with you, at home.

Library lessons take place during Tutor times, twice a module, but students can access the library every day between 8am and 3pm.

Small group reading will take place with teachers and students will be expected to review their reading material verbally.

The Sir Geoffrey Leigh Virtual Library is available for ALL students so that reading material is available at the academy, at home and because it is digital, anywhere you may happen to be.



Star Testing:

To make sure your child is making progress with their reading, they will have **Star Reading tests** during the school year.

The first set of testing takes place during the week beginning **Monday 30th September**

You will receive your child's results and guidelines on how to help them improve their reading abilities

Star Testing:

Students who are identified as requiring extra help with their reading will be provided with extra interventions, for example, with phonics if need be.

Maths

Assessments:

- Internally assessed throughout the year (tasks, h/w, quizzes, etc.)
- Every module there is one criterion formal assessment
- Mastery in Mathematics exploring mathematics to ensure conceptual understanding

Equipment:

To make sure that in every Maths lesson students have:

- Scientific calculator
- Pen and pencils
- Ruler
- Compasses and protractor

- Breathe










