

Our colleges

Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy follows a human-scale model of education, placing students into one of four colleges during their school journey: Shakespeare College, Mandela College, Curie College, and Seacole College. Students then transition to Attenborough College for their Post-16 studies. This college system ensures that every child is known, valued, and supported to achieve their potential in a community that encourages engagement in learning, fosters strong, nurturing relationships, and promotes respect for self, others, and the wider world.



Shakespeare College

William Shakespeare (1564–1616) is celebrated as one of the greatest writers in English literature. He authored around 37 plays and over 150 poems, introducing more than 1,700 words still used today. Shakespeare's creativity, knowledge, and influence make him an enduring role model. In Shakespeare College, we encourage students to be creative, reflective, and responsible learners. Students are supported to become confident communicators who work collaboratively with peers and adults, embodying the values of curiosity and enthusiasm in all they do.



Mandela College

Nelson Mandela (1918–2013), social rights activist and South Africa's first Black president, is remembered for his resilience and lifelong commitment to freedom, equality, and justice. In Mandela College, we inspire students to emulate Mandela's perseverance, integrity, and dedication to social responsibility, fostering a community that respects and upholds these values in both school and society.



Curie College

Marie Curie (1867–1934), a pioneering scientist, was the first woman to win a Nobel Prize and the only person to win in two different sciences. Her work in radioactivity, radium, and polonium exemplifies curiosity, ambition, and resilience. In Curie College, students are encouraged to pursue their passions, embrace challenges, and innovate, developing the perseverance and problem-solving skills necessary to make a positive impact on society.



Seacole College

Mary Seacole (1805–1881), a Jamaican-British nurse, healer, and businesswoman, is remembered for her courage, compassion, and determination during the Crimean War. Seacole exemplified care, resilience, open-mindedness, and principled action. In Seacole College, students are encouraged to adopt these values, developing empathy, courage, and problem-solving skills while being inspired to act with integrity in their own lives.

Our curriculum

At Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy, we pride ourselves on delivering a broad, balanced, and ambitious curriculum that allows every student to explore new subjects, develop essential skills, and discover their individual strengths. We believe that all students have the potential to achieve excellence, and we encourage them to challenge themselves, nurture their interests, and celebrate their own unique areas of expertise.

Our students follow a three-year Key Stage 3 curriculum. In Year 9, they make informed choices about the subjects they wish to pursue at GCSE level. Beyond GCSE, we actively encourage students to continue their learning journey within our Post-16 provision, where they can access a diverse range of academic and vocational pathways.



In addition to traditional subjects, we are proud to deliver an innovative Healthy Minds programme. Ofsted (2023) praised it as "an extremely well-thoughtout programme covering all the important topics." This programme equips students with the knowledge, resilience, and personal skills they need to thrive, both in school and beyond. Healthy Minds lessons are timetabled weekly for all students in Years 7, 8, and 9.

Student support

At Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy, we are committed to supporting every student so that they feel safe, valued, and able to thrive both academically and personally.

Each college community is supported by a Student Services Manager (SSM) and a Student Services Officer (SSO) — non-teaching staff who are available throughout the day to provide pastoral support and guidance. In addition, every student is part of a tutor group, with daily contact from their tutor who oversees their holistic development and wellbeing.

We believe it is our duty to provide equal opportunities for all students and to create a safe, inclusive learning environment where individuality is respected. Our approach to support and inclusion ensures that every young person can access the curriculum, participate fully in school life, and achieve their potential.

Chromebooks

The academy operates a Google Chromebook scheme for all of our students, which ensures that every student has access to their own device to use throughout their education with us. We believe that the Chromebook provides students with the opportunity to learn any time, any place, and offers greater flexibility in completing assignments and

developing independent learning skills, both in lessons and at home. For parents and carers, it also provides a unique window into your child's learning and enables you to be involved and informed about their progress on a daily basis. Students can only use LAT devices on our network.



Special Educational Needs and Inclusion

SGLA adopts a holistic approach to special educational needs and disabilities (SEND). All staff are trained to support inclusion, ensuring students with additional needs are able to achieve positive outcomes.

Hearing Impaired Specialist Resource-Based Provision

Our Inclusion Hub includes a specialist resource base for hearing impaired students with severe to profound hearing loss. We are developing a total communication, child-led approach, ensuring that each student's needs are assessed and supported individually using a range of strategies.

- Students are primarily taught in mainstream classes, ensuring full inclusion with their peers.
- Specialist lessons, audiology, and speech and language therapy are delivered within the resource base.
- Our specialist team works closely with mainstream teachers to ensure accessibility and progress.

Speech, Language and Communication Specialist Resource Provision

We also provide a resource-based provision for students with speech, language, and communication needs (SLCN), identified through their Education, Health and Care (EHC) plans.

- Students spend the majority of their time in mainstream lessons.
- They also access specialist support through smallgroup teaching and therapy sessions.
- Support is delivered by a dedicated team of speech and language therapists, specialist teachers, and learning support assistants, enabling independence and full access to the curriculum.

Careers education and work-related learning

At SGLA, we prepare students for success in a global community through a robust careers education and work-related learning programme.

- We hold the Investor in Careers Award, reflecting our commitment to high-quality careers guidance.
- Our careers programme follows the Career Development Institute (CDI) guidelines, ensuring structured and meaningful provision.
- We help students make informed choices, link learning to future pathways, and develop skills for lifelong success.

Through careers education, we ensure students understand the relevance of their learning and are fully prepared for life beyond education.

Post-16 Study

Post-16 is a thriving part of academy life at Sir Geoffrey Leigh Academy, led by a dedicated team committed to opening doors for the young adults in our care. Our aim is simple: to support every student in becoming the very best version of themselves, fully prepared for the next step — whether that be university, apprenticeships, or employment.

We offer a wide choice of courses, providing pathways that are bespoke to the needs of our students:

- International Baccalaureate Career Related Programme
- Vocational BTEC/AAQs (applied and technical qualifications)
- Blended (a combination of academic and vocational study)

We deliver the International Baccalaureate (IB) Career-related Programme (CP) — an internationally recognised and highly valued qualification that equips students with the resilience, independence, and skills required for success in higher education and the workplace. From September 2026, the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme will be available to our Post 16 students.

Support and Study Environment

Post-16 students benefit from:

- Dedicated study spaces across the Academy to suit independent and collaborative learning;
- A Chromebook scheme to support digital learning;
- Strong pastoral care from form tutors and the Post-16 team;
- Personalised careers advice and guidance to make informed future choices.

Students also have structured study periods, alongside opportunities for community service, work experience, or paid employment, encouraging a balanced and responsible approach to life inside and outside the Academy.

This framework ensures that Post-16 students are not only successful academically but also grow into confident, responsible role models.

We greatly value the role our Post-16 students play in shaping the wider life of the Academy. Through positions on the Post-16 Leadership Team, students have the chance to influence provision, represent their peers, and take on responsibilities that build leadership skills and prepare them for life beyond school.

Attenborough College

Our Post-16 provision, Attenborough College, is named after Sir David Attenborough, the renowned environmentalist, scientist, and broadcaster. His lifelong dedication to the natural world demonstrates the IB learner profile attribute of being balanced—recognising the interdependence of people and the planet. At Attenborough College, students are encouraged to develop critical thinking, independence, and global awareness, preparing them to make informed and responsible decisions as they move on to higher education, apprenticeships, or employment.

The Curriculum prepares pupils well for the future. Regular careers, education and advice shine a light on the various options open to them. Pupils gain a range of qualifications.
